Legislators will take up rule recommendations in the early days of the session before moving on to bills that were carried over from last year. The Legislature convenes on January 3rd; this will be the "short" 60-day session that will conclude the 2023-24 biennium.

The deadline to submit comments for the official hearing record has passed but you may continue to submit comments as the Legislative session progresses.



The second session of the 108th Nebraska Legislature will convene January 3rd, 2024. The 2024 session is a 60-day "short session." Legislative activity will proceed at full speed, with much to accomplish right from the start. Following an anticipated rules debate, senators will begin debating the many carryover priority bills from the 2023 session.

This will be the final legislative session for 13 term-limited senators – what will they be able to add to their legacy? Like 2023, it is anticipated that priority designations will be the key to getting bills across the finish line in these short, fast-moving 60 days.

Our team has been gearing up for the 2024 session with the intention of continuing the momentous legislative accomplishments achieved in 2023. We'll be working with legislators, their staff, and other policy influencers in support of advancing bills promoting the "Good Life."

Your copy should address 3 key questions: Who am I writing for? (Audience) Why should they care? (Benefit) What do I want them to do here? (Call-to-Action)

Create a great offer by adding words like "free" "personalized" "complimentary" or "customized." A sense of urgency often helps readers take an action, so think about inserting phrases like "for a limited time only" or "only 7 remaining"!

Veteran loses 140 pounds with VA TeleMOVE! program

Many Veterans are working to improve their health and well-being. For those wanting to make healthy lifestyle changes, VA's <u>TeleMOVE!</u> program is ready to help Veterans manage their weight, eat wisely and be more physically active. TeleMOVE! care coordinators partner with Veterans to create personalized, monitored health and weight management plans.

Navy Combat Veteran Reid Kochel began TeleMOVE! at the suggestion of his care team at <u>Black Hills VA</u>. Since starting the program, he has lost over 140 pounds.

VA now offers online ordering for CPAP supplies

Veterans who rely on CPAP (continuous positive airway pressure) machines to manage sleep-related breathing disorders, including sleep apnea, now have a new <u>streamlined online ordering system for CPAP supplies.</u>

VA has added the CPAP supply ordering feature as part of the online tool that's already in place, same as how Veterans <u>order hearing aid supplies</u> on VA.gov. The addition improves how Veterans order, manage and efficiently receive health care supplies. It's a notable improvement to the previous CPAP supply ordering process, which was by phone call or traditional mail order forms sent to VA's Denver Logistics Center (DLC).

What Does the Space Force Do? 4 Years After Its Birth, Glimpses of the Service's Mission Emerge

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colorado -- Staring at the computer screen in an office complex not too far from Schriever and Peterson Space Force Bases, a Guardian had a rapidly diminishing timer with only eight minutes left to carefully type in the complex computer code needed to hack an enemy satellite.

The low-Earth orbit satellite, which was traveling at roughly 18,000 miles an hour, was reportedly gathering intelligence about U.S. military assets across the Midwest, Southeast, Gulf of Mexico and Eastern Seaboard on four passes -- leaving only a small contact window in which the Guardians could work to stop the enemy from collecting photos and reconnaissance.

More Burial and Funeral Costs Can Now Be Covered by Veterans Benefits

The <u>Department of Veterans Affairs</u> is expanding benefits to help pay for veterans' end-of-life expenses, the department announced Friday.

The expanded benefits include reimbursements for transporting remains to state and tribal veterans cemeteries, in addition to previously eligible national cemeteries; allowances for VA plots or interments for tribal organizations; and higher payments for non-service-connected burial benefits, according to a news release Friday.

2023: End-of-year Veteran benefits update

Veterans have applied for benefits at record rates over the past year. As a result of your applications, VA has been able to deliver more earned benefits to more Veterans than ever before, including \$150 billion during 2023 alone.

They were part of the PACT Outreach Team that conducted over 70 PACT Act Information events that helped enroll Veterans for the care and benefits they deserve.

Shortly after the passage of the act, Battle Creek VA's PACT Act Outreach Team embarked on a mission to ensure that no Veteran in their 21-county catchment area faced unnecessary barriers to enrollment and screening.

Traveling to senior centers, county offices and private venues throughout southwest Michigan, the PACT Act Outreach Team brought details about the expanded eligibility and benefits to Veterans of many different eras. Veteran Service Organizations, on-site health care enrollment, and toxic agent screening were available to Veterans during the events.

Thanks to their hard work, Battle Creek VA enrolled 2,331 new Veterans last year, which was an increase of over 600 versus the previous year. Over 26,000 Toxic Exposure Screenings have been conducted as well, surpassing the goal by 111%, and with an average of 88% of follow-ups completed within 30 days.
