Nebraska Veterans Aid Fund (NVA)

- 1. The NVA Fund was established in 1921. This temporary emergency aid fund assists veterans, their spouses, and dependents when an emergency occurs disrupting their normal method of living and when other resources are not immediately available. For NVA purposes, veteran means any person who:served on active duty in the armed forces of the United States, other than active duty for training, and who:
 - 2. was discharged or otherwise separated with a characterization of honorable or general (under honorable conditions) from such service; or
 - 3. died while in service or as a direct result of such service; or
- 4. being a citizen of the United States at the time of his or her entry into such service, served with the military forces of any government allied with the United States during any period identified in section 80-401.01 and was discharged or otherwise separated with a characterization of honorable or general (under honorable conditions) from

such service.

All income from the fund is used for aid and not for administrative expenses of the fund. Aid can only be used for food, fuel, shelter, transportation, daycare, wearing apparel, funeral, medical and surgical items. Application must be made through the <u>County Veterans Service</u> <u>Officer</u> or Post Service Officer of any recognized veterans service organization in the county nearest the applicant's place of residence and submitted to the Nebraska Department of Veterans' MORE: https://veterans.nebraska.gov/nva

A County Veterans Service Office staff provides confidential counseling and assistance to Veterans and their families who are applying for Federal, State, and County Veterans programs and benefits. Federal Veterans Benefits include Education Benefits, Vocational Rehabilitation, Service-connected disability, Non-service disability pension, Healthcare, and Burial benefits.

Nebraska Veterans programs include waiver of tuition, admittance to a Nebraska Veterans home, and emergency financial assistance from the Nebraska Veterans Aid Fund.

Eligibility for State financial assistance requires Honorable or General (Under Honorable Conditions) discharge from active duty. This requirement is not met by active duty for training only.

(Specific residency and service dates are required for some State Benefits)

LB1004 - Change motorcycle, moped, and autocycle helmet provisions

Apr 02, 2024Approved by Governor on April 2, 2024

Mar 28, 2024Passed on Final Reading with Emergency Clause Yes: 39; No- 4-(Bostelman, Cavanaugh j., Fredrickson; Raybold)) (Present not voting 3- Ripepe, Moser, McKinney); Excused -3

Section 1. Section 60-6,279, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2023, is amended to read:

60-6,279 (1) A person shall not operate or be a passenger on a motorcycle or moped on any highway in this state unless such person is:

(a) Wearing a protective helmet of the type and design manufactured for use by operators of such vehicles and unless such helmet is secured properly on the user's head with a chin strap while the vehicle is in motion. All such protective helmets shall be designed to reduce injuries to the user resulting from head impacts and shall be designed to protect the user by remaining on the user's head, deflecting blows, resisting penetration, and spreading the force of impact. Each such helmet shall consist of lining, padding, and chin strap and shall meet or exceed the standards established in the United States Department of Transportation's Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard No. 218, 49 C.F.R. 571.218, for motorcycle helmets; or

(b) Beginning January 1, 2024:

(b)(i) (i) At least twenty-one years of age; and

(ii)(A) Has a Nebraska Class M license and received such Class M license prior to May 1, 2024, and has completed the Motorcycle Safety Foundation three-hour Basic eCourse and submitted proof of such completion to the Department of Motor Vehicles. Proof of such completion shall be in a manner approved by the department; MORE: See Slip Law



TFL is Medicare-wraparound coverage for military retirees and their family members who are TRICARE-eligible and have <u>Medicare Part A and Part B</u>. Medicare is your primary health coverage when you have TFL.

"This means that Medicare pays first on a health care claim," said Anne Breslin, TRICARE For Life program manager. "TRICARE pays second, or last if you have other health insurance."

All veterans exposed to toxins and other hazards during military service eligible for VA health care beginning March 5

Today, the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs announced that all veterans who were exposed to toxins and other hazards while serving in the military — at home or abroad — will be eligible to enroll directly in VA health care beginning March 5, 2024. This means that all veterans who served in the Vietnam War, the Gulf War, Iraq, Afghanistan, the Global War on Terror, or any other combat zone after 9/11 will be eligible to enroll directly in VA health care without first applying for VA benefits. Additionally, veterans who never deployed but were exposed to toxins or hazards while training or on active duty in the United States will also be eligible to enroll. VA halts taking away gun rights from veterans who require help managing their benefits — but only for 6 months

WASHINGTON — A new ban that has stopped the Department of Veterans Affairs from taking away

the gun rights of veterans who are found to be incapable of managing their own financial affairs will expire in six months, VA officials said. The VA in March ended its weekly practice of submitting the names of veterans appointed fiduciaries to handle their VA disability benefits to the FBI's national background check database. The database contains information on people prohibited from buying or receiving firearms. Inclusion in the database legally disqualifies veterans from owning, possessing or buying firearms from licensed dealers.

<u>UK Will Deploy Drone Defense Lasers On Warships In 2027</u>

ANALYSIS – Britain's <u>Ministry of Defense</u> (MOD) will install <u>lasers</u> on warships designed to shoot down drones starting in 2027. The low-cost <u>DragonFire</u> can hit a 25mm target from 1,000 meters away.

The space-age weapon will work by using an intense beam of light to cut through its target. The MOD hopes the DragonFire system will offer a low-cost alternative to missiles in shooting down attack drones and even mortars.

The MOD said that the <u>laser-directed energy weapon</u> (LDEW) could fire at any target visible in the air at around \$12.52 per shot.


In comparison, the Sea Viper missiles, previously used by Britain to intercept Houthi drones in the Red Sea, were estimated to cost a staggering \$1.26 million each.

"In a more dangerous world, our approach to procurement is shifting with it... our widespread reforms will deliver the latest kit and weaponry for our Armed Forces faster," Defense Secretary Grant Shapps said.

This could have "huge ramifications" for Kyiv's conflict against Russia, Grant Shapps said. The new reforms aimed at speeding up procurement mean the laser, which was originally set to be rolled out in 2032, will now be operational five years earlier than planned.

<u>Most People In Nebraska Don't Know That Fort Robinson Was A</u> <u>German POW Camp In WWII</u>

Or maybe you're familiar with the state park's breathtaking landscapes, bountiful recreational activities, and historic lodging. There's one part of Fort Robinson's history, though, that many people aren't aware of: it served as Nebraska's largest German POW camp in World War II.

The B-21 Raider gets amazing Aviation Week Grand Laureate Award

Northrop Grumman received the Aviation Week Grand Laureate Award in the defense category for its role as the prime contractor delivering the B-21 Raider to the United States Air Force.

Aviation Week announced the Grand Laureate winners at its 66th Annual Laureate awards in Washington, D.C.

In the fall of 2023, the Air Force confirmed the first B-21 test vehicle had entered flight test, followed by low-rate initial production award. The aircraft is currently undergoing a robust flight test campaign executed by the B-21 Combined Test Force at Edwards Air Force Base in California. The program continues to meet all DOD technical, schedule and affordability requirements on its path to operational capability.

Developed with the next generation of stealth technology, advanced networking capabilities and open systems architecture, the B-21 Raider will serve as the backbone of America's bomber fleet. Capable of delivering both conventional and nuclear payloads, the B-21 will be one of the most effective aircraft in the sky, with the ability to use a broad mix of stand-off and direct attack munitions.

The National Park Service in partnership with Operation Live Well offers free military passes to thank America's veterans, Gold Star Families, current military and their dependents for their support of our country. The passes are provided to encourage them to explore recreational opportunities on their public lands and waters.

- A free <u>lifetime Military Pass</u> is available for Gold Star Families and U.S. military veterans.
- A free <u>annual Military Pass</u> is available for current U.S. service members and their dependents.

The passes provide free access to more than 2,000 federal recreation areas, including national parks, wildlife refuges, and forests.

The National Defense Authorization Act of 2022 expanded the Interagency Pass Program and authorized a free Military Lifetime pass to National Parks and other federal recreational lands for eligible veterans and Gold Star Families.
