Legislation

Senator Tom Brewer 43rd District 5-17-2024

In 2021 I passed LB 387. This bill exempted military retired pay from Nebraska state income tax. For decades thousands of retiring service members, many of them Nebraskans, did not come home because they could live in a state that did not tax their retired pay. I am happy to report I have heard from an increasing number of retiring service members who have told me they are coming home to the state they were born and raised in because of this bill. A senator does not often receive feedback from a bill passing that is as rewarding as this is. Causing this to happen is exactly why I introduced this bill.

This past session I passed LB 1394. This bill exempts National Guard week-end drill pay, and pay for National Guard active duty for training or State emergencies. The fiscal note on this bill "cost" the legislature about \$2 million in lost revenue. Forty one senators supported the bill, eight senators opposed the bill. Seven were excused for the final vote, and one was present, not voting. Their argument against the bill was based on the idea the legislature could not afford to lose \$2M in revenue.

I think it is important for people to understand that before something can "cost" you, it first must belong to you. The \$11.7 billion collected in Nebraska taxes must first be taken from someone who worked for and earned the money in the first place. Just because it is in Nebraska's treasury does not mean it is the property of senators in the legislature.

The authorized strength of the Nebraska National Guard is low, around 92%. They are having

a hard time recruiting and retaining soldiers. We are going to see if this \$2.23M going back into the pockets of Guard members will help us restore the ranks. This is who we call when things get really bad and citizens are in danger. I think \$2M is a bargain considering who will be receiving it and what we depend on them to do for Nebraska.

Iowa's spending restraint has allowed the Hawkeye State to accelerate previously-enacted tax reforms. Thanks to a <u>package of new tax reforms</u>, Iowa's income tax will be lowered to a flat 3.8% beginning in 2025, far less than half the state's 8.98% top rate when Iowa's tax reforms began.

The Hawkeye State's accelerating tax relief adds pressure on Nebraska's eastern border, proving once again that states can fall behind on tax competitiveness by simply standing still. Nebraska enacted the nation's best tax reforms in 2023, yet Iowa is responding by advancing its reforms still further.

And that's not all. One of the benefits of a low, flat tax rate is that it allows families and businesses to plan their finances with certainty. Iowa is looking to lock in certainty through constitutional law with a pair of tax amendments that will ensure Iowa stays competitive for generations.

First, Iowa lawmakers are asking voters to approve a<u>constitutional amendment</u> that will require a two-thirds supermajority vote of the legislature in order to raise taxes. This amendment mirrors a similar provision that Florida added to their constitution. Seventeen states, including progressive states like California and Oregon, require a supermajority vote to raise taxes. Nebraska should join this group.

Iowa lawmakers referred a second <u>amendment</u> for constitutional consideration that will protect the state's single-rate tax system. Iowa's historical multi-rate tax structure will become a single-rate 3.8% in 2025. And Governor Reynolds and other Hawkeye lawmakers have signaled their intent to lower the rate still further in future legislative sessions. In sum, Iowa's income tax system will become more competitive more quickly. Voter approval of constitutional updates will make these reforms nearly unshakeable. While Nebraska lawmakers have focused on the property tax in 2024, it is crucial to ensure all funds for property tax relief are delivered in full by enacting strict caps on property taxes. Nebraska lawmakers should anticipate Iowa's income tax becoming more competitive every year. With such a competitive landscape, there's not a dollar to spare on subsidizing local spending while surrounding states accelerate tax relief.

THE COST OF DEMOCRACY:

An Overview and Analysis of the Cost of Elections to Nebraska Counties

The goal of this brief was to provide information that may spur others to discuss the way that elections are funded, who pays for elections, and whether there is a better way of ensuring that elections are both secure and fair for all voters. A few points follow, but please see the note below for more information about neighboring states' processes.

Executive Summary

A Primary election is a pre-election process for choosing candidates for the general election. In Nebraska (for all but a few municipal elections), the primary occurs in May, preceding the general election in November.

Nebraska conducts non-partisan primaries (legislative, many local races) and partisan primaries (statewide, federal, and some local races). Any registered voter can vote on the non-partisan primary ballot. To receive a partisan primary ballot, a voter must be registered (with some exceptions) with the party whose ballot they receive. Parties must specifically open their

primaries to non-affiliated voters if they wish for them to be able to vote on their primary hallot.

Elections are administered primarily at the county level in Nebraska, with each county

having an election commissioner (in smaller counties, the county clerk serves in that role). In this

paper we look only at the costs to counties for conducting elections, and compare costs of primary elections vs. general elections.

While primary elections are typically participated in by voters at a much lower rate than general elections, the cost of administering the primary election in most counties costs all taxpayers as much as or more than the general election



Proudly Serving Nebraska & Iowa

The Veterans Business Outreach Center (VBOC) Program is designed to proudly provide entrepreneurial development services such as business training, counseling, and resource partner referrals to transitioning service members, veterans, National Guard & Reserve members, and military spouses interested in starting or growing a small business. VBOC at Nebraska Enterprise Fund is funded in part through a Cooperative Agreement with the U.S. Small Business Administration.

Services Provided by the Centers

Pre-Business Plan Workshops

VBOCs conduct entrepreneurial development workshops dealing specifically with the major issues of self-employment. An important segment of these workshops entails the usage of the Internet as a tool for developing and expanding businesses. Each client is afforded the opportunity to work directly with a business counselor.

Concept Assessments

VBOCs assist clients in assessing their entrepreneurial needs and requirements.

Business Plan Preparations

VBOCs assist clients in developing and maintaining a five-year business plan. The business plan includes such elements as the legal form of the business, equipment requirements and cost, organizational structure, a strategic plan, market analysis, and a financial plan. Financial plans include financial projections, budget projections, and funding requirements.

Comprehensive Feasibility Analysis

VBOCs provide assistance in identifying and analyzing the strengths and weaknesses of the business plan to increase the probability of success. The results of the analysis are utilized to revise the strategic planning portion of the business plan.

Entrepreneurial Training and Counseling

VBOCs, working with other SBA resource partners, target entrepreneurial training projects and counseling sessions tailored specifically to address the needs and concerns of the service-disabled veteran entrepreneur.

Mentorship

VBOCs conduct, as appropriate, on-site visits with clients to ensure adherence to their business plans. Additionally, VBOCs review monthly financial statements to determine whether a revision of the business plan is warranted or that desired results are being attained.

Resources for Veterans

Boots to Business (B2B) is an entrepreneurial education and training program offered by SBA as part of the Department of Defense's Transition Assistance Program (TAP). B2B provides participants with an overview of business ownership and is open to transitioning service members (including National Guard and Reserve) and their spouses. Classes are at Offutt Air Force Base in Bellevue, Nebraska.

The Eastern Nebraska Veterans' Home (ENVH) has 120 licensed beds grouped in four wings: two 30-bed skilled nursing care wings, 30 assisted living beds, and 30 beds for skilled dementia care. Specialized services such as physical therapy, plus a wide range of recreational and religious services are offered to members. A future addition to the home was considered and included in the original design and construction in 2005. Expansion: This two-phase project includes an expansion that will add nearly 25,000 gross square feet (GSF) to the facility, which is currently just over 120,000 GSF, and a remodel of one of the current neighborhoods. The new neighborhood, called Honor, will have 24 single occupancy, assisted living beds as well as space to provide a new Adult Day Health Care (ADHC) Medical Model program. This new service will help veterans and families who may not yet need skilled care but need something to bridge the gap between in-home living and 24-hour care.

A County Veterans Service Office staff provides confidential counseling and assistance to Veterans and their families who are applying for Federal, State, and County Veterans programs and benefits. Federal Veterans Benefits include Education Benefits, Vocational Rehabilitation, Service-connected disability, Non-service disability pension, Healthcare, and Burial benefits.

Nebraska Veterans programs include waiver of tuition, admittance to a Nebraska Veterans home, and emergency financial assistance from the Nebraska Veterans Aid Fund.

Eligibility for State financial assistance requires Honorable or General (Under Honorable Conditions) discharge from active duty. This requirement is not met by active duty for training only. (Specific residency and service dates are required for some State Benefits)

2024 Big Game Guide online now

Application, drawing and sales dates for Nebraska big game hunting permits have been adjusted for 2024. That's just one of the changes in the <u>2024 Big Game Guide</u> posted on the Nebraska Game and Parks Commission's website <u>OutdoorNebraska.gov</u>.

The guide is a summary of Nebraska's regulations, orders and statutes pertaining to hunting deer, antelope, elk and bighorn sheep.

Some of the changes this year simplify the application and purchasing process for deer, elk and antelope permits by collapsing eight purchasing periods to four. Notably, general applications will begin a week earlier than in past years, starting June 3 in 2024.

A summary of the changes is on page 4 of the guide.


