<u>District 30 Update - Special Session</u> <u>Senator Myron Dorn</u>

The Special Session of the Legislature ended this week. We convened July 25 and met for 17 legislative days, making this special session the longest in more than 60 years. The first three days were designated for bill introduction. Every bill had a public hearing, but of the nearly 100 measures I introduced, only a half dozen or so were debated by the full legislature.

By caring for Veterans, Service Members and their Families in a family-based clinic, and working in cooperation with the US Departments of Defense (DoD) and Veterans Affairs (VA), Home Base serves as a replicable model to promote the health and well-being of Veterans, Service Members and their Families nationwide.

DIRECT CLINICAL CARE FOR SERVICE MEMBERS, VETERANS, FAMILIES, & FAMILIES OF THE FALLEN Providing timely, quality, and compassionate clinical care is one of the

most critical components of healing invisible wounds. Home Base has developed three clinical models to serve Veterans and Families who live around the globe:

NATIONAL INTENSIVE CLINICAL PROGRAM (ICP) This first of its kind 2-week ICP compresses 2 years of mental health, brain injury &/or substance use treatment into a 2-week program. Specially designed for Veterans of all eras, this program includes Family Members in the care model. A Special Iteration for Families of the Fallen is also offered to those who have experienced the suicide of their loved Veteran and need a path of recovery from grief and trauma.

NATIONAL SPECIAL OPERATIONS CLINIC

The Comprehensive Brain Health and Trauma (ComBHaT) Program provides coordinated, integrated, multi-disciplinary specialist evaluation, treatment, and care coordination for Special Operations Service Members and Veterans across the country. REGIONAL OUTPATIENT CLINICAL CARE

With clinics located in Massachusetts, Florida, and soon-to-be Arizona, Home Base provides advanced in-person and telehealth care to Veterans, Service Members, and their Families in their local communities.

WARRIOR HEALTH & FITNESS

Warrior Health & Fitness is designed to improve physical health and wellbeing through supervised exercise, nutrition, mind-body medicine, stress management, and sleep. Combined with a Veteran and Family Adventure Series that hosts our military community through skiing, museum visits, apple picking, and more, the wellness mission recognizes the holistic importance of healing.

TRAINING IN UNDER-RESOURCED COMMUNITIES

The Home Base Training Institute has educated over 80,000 clinicians and first responders to recognize and treat the invisible wounds of war. This training propels strategic partnerships to address care in under-resourced community health centers caring for our Veterans of Color and a new initiative with Native American Veterans in the Navajo Nation. Through leveraging 21st-century technology to discover new treatments in healing the invisible wounds of war, Home Base harnesses the scientific community of Mass General Brigham, Harvard, and national partners to find the most innovative solutions of tomorrow.

Home Base Nation Podcast reaches audiences across the country and features stories of people and topics that have an important impact on our Veteran, Military and patriotic communities. Highlighted guests include Jake Tapper, Spike Lee, David "Big Papi" Ortiz, Sebastian Junger, and topics such as art therapy, psychedelics research, and the USS Intrepid with Prince Harry.

Healing the invisible wounds of war through PTSD treatment for veterans Warrior Care Network® is a partnership between Wounded Warrior Project® (WWP) and four world-renowned academic medical centers, providing veterans and service members living with post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), traumatic brain injury (TBI), military sexual trauma (MST), and other related conditions with a path to long-term wellness. Participants and their families receive first-class treatment tailored specifically to their needs and individualized care to support their unique journey. All treatment and accommodations are provided at no cost and financial assistance is also offered to help cover everyday expenses like groceries, utilities, and housing.

Warrior Care Network Success Stories

Treatments

This two-week intensive outpatient program uses evidenced-based clinical treatments and complementary wellness and health services to fast-track the journey to better mental and brain health. VA launches updated Burn Pit Registry

Today, the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs announced the launch of the redesigned Airborne Hazards and Open Burn Pit Registry (Burn Pit Research Registry). The Burn Pit Registry is a database that combines veteran and servicemember data to help VA better understand, research, and ultimately improve treatment for the health challenges facing veterans exposed to airborne hazards and burn pits during their military service. The registry is an important research tool that enables VA to identify and study health challenges spanning the veteran and servicemember population as a whole - providing veterans and servicemembers an opportunity to help improve the care and benefits of veterans and servicemembers in generations to come. The registry will now include more than 4.7 million veterans and servicemembers who meet participation criteria based on Department of Defense records.o

SBA Opens Nominations for 2025 National Small Business Week <u>Awards</u>

WASHINGTON – Today, <u>Administrator Isabel Casillas Guzman</u>, head of the <u>U.S. Small Business</u> <u>Administration (SBA)</u> and the voice in President Biden's Cabinet for America's more than 34 million small businesses, opened <u>nominations</u> for the 2025 National Small Business Week (NSBW) Awards. For more than 60 years the SBA has been uplifting small businesses in America, and the annual NSBW awards recognize the exemplary achievements, triumphs, contributions, and resilience of SBA-assisted individuals and businesses that help to drive the American economy.

"From corner shops to innovation hubs, American entrepreneurs create jobs, invent and provide crucial products and services to their communities, and help define the neighborhoods they serve," said Administrator Guzman. "The SBA is proud to celebrate National Small Business Week each year to lift up the best of that American entrepreneurial spirit and recognize the many essential contributions all of our small businesses make to our nation."

A business owner from each of the 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and Guam is selected for individual State SBPOTY winner awards and the state award winners will compete for the 2025 National Small Business Person of the Year title.

Disabled Veteran Park Permit

Disabled Veterans who are legal residents of Nebraska and who have been deemed 50 percent or more service related or 100 percent disabled non-service connected and receive a pension from the Veterans Administration, are eligible for one (1) perpetual Disabled Veteran's Lifetime Annual Park Entry Permit at no fee.

Nebraska Game and Parks Service Centers can provide information and print out the application for the guests; however; the guests need to send the application to the Department of Veterans Affairs for certification or, to the Permit Section in Lincoln if they have already met the qualifications as a result of prior application for a disabled veteran Hunt/Fish permit. To apply for a Disabled Veteran's Permit via the mail, fill out the application below and mail to:

Lost or stolen park permits are not eligible for replacement.

For eligible replacement requests (defective permit, traded vehicle, windshield replacement, accident, etc.) remove all or more than half of the permit sticker, complete and send in the <u>Replacement Disabled Veteran Lifetime Park Entry Permit form</u>.

Veteran Hunt/Fish/Fur Permit

Veterans age 64 and older who are legal residents of Nebraska are eligible for a Veteran's Annual Small Game Hunt/Fish/Fur Harvest Permit for \$5. This permit includes all state stamps. A copy of a DD214 or a Veteran Indicator on the applicant's Nebraska Driver's License must be presented in person at the time of application at a Game and Parks office, service center or park location. If a copy of a DD214 is not available, an application form and signature from a Veteran's Service officer is required.

The Veteran Hunt/Fish/Fur Harvest Permit must be renewed annually for \$5. It may be renewed at any Game and Parks office, online or at one of our vendor locations. Renewal does not require a copy of a DD214 or an application form. Customers can also set up auto renewal for their permit and stamps through the online permit system by selecting the Auto Renew boxes.

Deployed Military Hunt/Fish/Fur Permit

A Nebraska resident who is or has been deployed out of the state with a branch of the United States military within the last 12 months shall, upon returning to the state, be eligible to receive an Annual Small Game Hunt/Fish/Fur Harvest Permit on a one time basis for \$5. This permit includes all state stamps. A copy of deployment paperwork must be presented in person at the time of application.

To apply for a Deployed Military Permit via the mail, fill out the application below and enclose a copy of your deployment papers and payment of \$5 at a Game and Parks office, service center or park location.

A County Veterans Service Office staff provides confidential counseling and assistance to Veterans and their families who are applying for Federal, State, and County Veterans programs and benefits. Federal Veterans

Benefits include Education Benefits, Vocational Rehabilitation, Service-connected disability, Non-service disability pension, Healthcare, and Burial benefits.

Nebraska Veterans programs include waiver of tuition, admittance to a Nebraska Veterans home, and emergency financial assistance from the Nebraska Veterans Aid Fund.

Eligibility for State financial assistance requires Honorable or General (Under Honorable Conditions) discharge from active duty. This requirement is not met by active duty for training only.

(Specific residency and service dates are required for some State Benefits)
