New VA program launches to help veterans avoid foreclosure on their homes

The VA Partial Claim program was authorized by the VA Home Loan Program Reform Act, which Congress passed last summer. It gives veterans and members of the military a way to get current on their mortgages without losing the original terms of their VA-backed loan. Under the program, which targets veterans at risk of defaulting on their home loans, the VA will pay mortgage servicers the overdue amount on a mortgage to help them get back on track. The servicer is the company that collects the money on a mortgage. Veterans will first need to complete a trial payment plan, making on-time payments for three straight months, to show they'll be able to stay current on their loan. In short, the program lets the VA give veterans an advance to cover missed loan payments. Veterans won't have to pay back the amount to the VA until the loan is paid in full or refinanced, or when the property is sold. Before then, there's no additional cost per month. According to the VA, veterans must work with loan servicers to begin the partial claim program. Servicers have until Nov. 28, 2026, to implement the partial claim into their systems.

TSA PreCheck for Qualifying Disabled Veterans

A benefit of the Veterans Expedited TSA Screening Safe Travel Act

TSA is working with the Department of Veterans Affairs on the Veterans Expedited TSA Screening (VETS) Safe Travel Act which provides free TSA PreCheck® enrollment to veterans with qualifying service-connected disabilities. TSA PreCheck allows travelers to experience smarter, faster airport security in dedicated lanes when they travel.

Eligibility for free TSA PreCheck enrollment under the VETS Safe Travel Act is limited to veterans enrolled in VA healthcare who have a service-connected disability of permanent blindness or require the use of a VA-issued wheelchair or prosthetic limb.

How it works

For veterans with a VA-issued eligibility letter, the enrollment fee waiver is available for a new TSA PreCheck enrollment or if you need to renew your membership.

To participate:

1. Obtain your VA eligibility letter: VA identifies eligible veterans and uploads the eligibility letter to your VA.gov account.

- Sign in to your [VA.gov account](#).
- Under Benefits and Healthcare, select Records, then click Download your VA benefits letters.
- Click Get your VA benefit letters.

2. Enroll in TSA PreCheck through IDEMIA*: Complete the application and attend an in-person visit to take fingerprints and a photo. Once approved, you will [receive your Known Traveler Number \(KTN\) within 3-5 days and can begin using TSA PreCheck](#). Please note, some applications can take up to 60 days.

Report of Damaged Property Due on or Before July 15th,

2026 <https://revenue.nebraska.gov/PAD/damaged-real-property>

JULY 1, 2026 (LINCOLN, NEB.) — The Department of Revenue, Property Assessment Division, reminds real property owners who have suffered significant damage to their property on or after

January 1 and before July 1, 2026, to file a Form 425, Report of Damaged Real Property, with their county clerk on or before Wednesday, July 15, 2026.

Real property owners may file a Report of Damaged Real Property to request that the county board of equalization consider the real property damage reflected in the report and determine if any adjustments should be made to the property's assessed value for the current year due to significant property damage. Property owners affected by the 2026 Wildfires are strongly encouraged to timely file a Form 425 with the county clerk in the county where the damaged land is located.

Pursuant to recent legislative changes, for each Report of Damaged Real Property that is filed, the county assessor must review and inspect the property, and complete the Form 425A, Assessor's Report of Damaged Real Property, to the county board of equalization on or before July 20th.

The county board of equalization must act upon this report on or after June 1 and on or before July 25, or on or before August 10 if the board has adopted a resolution to extend the deadline to hear protests under Neb. Rev. Stat. § 77-1502, and must send a notice of the reassessed value for the damaged real property to the owner. Significant property damage means:

1. Damage to an improvement exceeding 20% of the improvement's assessed value in the current tax year; or
2. Damage to the land exceeding 20% of land's assessed value in the current tax year.

LINCOLN, NE – Today, Governor Jim Pillen issued the following statement upon a 6-3 decision by the U.S. Supreme Court permitting states to ban transgender girls and women from participating on female sports teams.

“Today's ruling affirms many of the actions we have taken in Nebraska through the issuance of the Women's Bill of Rights, passage of the Stand with Women Act and my support of Sen. Kauth's LB730 last session.

Men do not belong in women's sports or spaces. The Supreme Court's decision affirming the rights of states to initiate these bans is a significant victory — one that will ensure fairness and fair play in women's sports.”

VA Benefits: Full List of Senators Pushing Back on Major Disability Change

A group of nearly 50 Senate Democrats and independents is pushing back against a proposed change to [Department of Veterans Affairs \(VA\) disability benefits](#) that they say could significantly reduce compensation for veterans suffering from [sleep apnea](#) and tinnitus.

"VA must make clear it will not punish veterans seeking effective sleep apnea treatments or deny veterans with service-connected tinnitus the benefits and health care they have earned," a letter from the lawmakers to VA Secretary Doug Collins read this week, in part

The opposition comes as part of a broader fight over a sweeping legislative package that includes the proposed changes that could affect more than 1 million veterans.

Why It Matters

The proposal has become one of the most consequential debates over [veterans' benefits](#) in years because it directly affects how the VA compensates some of the most common service-connected conditions. It also could reshape how disability payments are calculated going forward. By moving away from fixed disability ratings toward a system that ties compensation more closely to how well a condition is managed with treatment, payments for veterans whose conditions are controlled by medical care could drop sharply.

What To Know

The lawmakers in their letter to Collins this week referenced a February attempt by the VA to implement a new rule that stipulates that disability levels will be [based on how well veterans function while on medication](#), instead of the underlying disability or injury itself. The rule caused an uproar in the veteran community, [leading to its rescission](#).

Public Disability Benefits Questionnaires (DBQs)

DBQs help collect necessary medical information to process your disability claims. You can use these forms to submit medical evidence from your health care providers. This information helps to support your claims for disability benefits. Please have your health care provider fill out and submit the appropriate forms for your claimed conditions.

We do not pay or reimburse any expenses or costs incurred while completing and/or submitting DBQs.

In most instances, you're entitled to a no-cost disability examination by us. In some instances, we may determine an additional disability examination is required to complete the claim. If an exam is scheduled, you must report for the examination.

A County Veterans Service Office staff member provides confidential counseling and assistance to Veterans and their families applying for Federal, State, and County Veterans programs and benefits. Federal Veterans Benefits include education, vocational rehabilitation, service-connected disability compensation, non-service-connected disability pension, healthcare, and burial benefits. Nebraska Veterans programs include a tuition waiver, admittance to a Nebraska Veteran's home, and emergency financial assistance from the Nebraska Veterans Aid Fund. Eligibility for State financial assistance requires an Honorable or General (Under Honorable Conditions) discharge from active duty. This requirement is not met by active duty for training only. (Specific residency and service dates are required for some State Benefits)

Buy big game permits starting July 8

Hunters may begin purchasing Nebraska big game permits that are available over the counter in July for the 2026 seasons.

On July 8, residents may buy any available deer, antelope, and undrawn elk permits within limits, starting at 10 a.m. Central time. Eligible resident landowners may buy any limited landowner elk, deer and antelope permits subject to availability.

On July 22, nonresidents may buy any limited antelope and deer permits in any unit subject to availability and within permit limits. Eligible nonresident landowners may buy any limited landowner elk and antelope permits.

All sales begin at 10 a.m. Central time and continue through the close of hunting seasons or until the permit quotas sell out.
